In Memoriam

Zala Dilip Singh, age 38 of Punadra, drove a rickshaw and was the main breadwinner in his family, supporting his wife, two children (ages 13 and 19), and their grandmother. He received a positive COVID test and passed away from the virus, leaving his family overwhelmed with grief and without their main income source.

Abhasingh, of Ahmedabad, was a driver for — and more importantly, like a little brother to — one of ESI's Lokmitras, Jayeshbhai. In May, Abhasingh lost his father to a heart attack related to COVID complications. Just two weeks later, Abhasingh tested positive for COVID and was admitted to the hospital. Despite Jayeshbahai doing all he could to ensure the best medical care, Abhasingh passed away, leaving behind his wife and two children, ages 12 and 15.

Choose Compassion: Caring During Crisis

These stories are tragically becoming all too common during this crisis. According to the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, more than 3,600 children in India have been orphaned while more than 26,000 have lost one parent since April 2020. Meanwhile, the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy reports that the unemployment rate has nearly doubled from its already high pre-pandemic rate. Those aged 30-39

experienced a net loss of 5.9 million jobs, while those aged 40 and over experienced a net loss of 18.7 million jobs. These job losses not only endanger a family's ability to survive — they can also set back progress for generations.

Families who have experienced these losses turn to the government and NGOs for assistance to alleviate the burdens they are experiencing. To support these children and families, we have partnered with NGOs like ESI and the Mijwan Welfare Society, both of which assist families in many ways — including tending to their economic, social, and/or emotional needs. With our support, they provide necessary care to families which may include:

- Providing meal provisions and grocery support;
- Determining all applicable government and NGO assistance programs available to the family and assisting with securing those benefits;
- Placing eligible children into growth and education plans;
- Providing vaccination support to the families; and
- Following up with families to ensure they are cared for.
