



## HONOR DAD'S TEACHINGS THIS FATHER'S DAY

Our fathers, and the father figures in our lives, are some of our earliest teachers, helping shape who we ultimately become. As Father's Day approaches, we at Share & Care have been reflecting upon the best way to honor them, and thank them for their teachings and life lessons. We humbly ask that this Father's Day, you **celebrate your father or the father figure in your life by passing on his wisdom** through a gift to our Educate 2 Graduate Signature Program (E2G). Your gift can help deserving but underprivileged scholars — read on to meet just a few of them.

**Sakhiya Yagnik Pravinbhai**, from Surat, was able to pursue a degree in Technology using E2G scholarship funds. His father is employed as a diamond worker, earning Rs. 110,000 yearly. After graduating in 2021, Sakhiya began a job with Sprinklr in Bangalore, earning an annual salary of Rs. 3 million.



E2G provides up to \$1,000 of scholarship funding annually to a brilliant college student in financial need. These funds are issued over the course of four to five years as the student pursues a professional degree in engineering, medicine, information technology, pharmacy, or another discipline. **Share & Care has supported more than 1,750**

students, of which 1,200 have graduated and are now gainfully employed, drawing handsome salaries, and excelling in their chosen fields.

**Patel Kuldeep Jashubhai**, from Mehsana, finished his secondary course of study with high grades, and through E2G funding, he was able to successfully complete his education in Information and Communication Technology. His father had separated from the family and his mother did not work, so the family's income was just Rs. 12,000 per year, provided by his sister. An example of a student rising up from the poorest segment of society, after graduating in 2017, Patel secured a job with Amazon, initially earning Rs. 2.7 million. After four years there, he began working with Google, earning an annual salary of Rs. 10 million.



E2G is making a phenomenal financial impact on these graduates and their families. Data collected from over 800 working-graduates shows that, with an average annual salary of Rs. 4 lac per year and an annual salary ranging from 2 lac to 50 lac per year, they have increased their family incomes tremendously. **These employed graduates have liberated their families from the vicious cycle of poverty and transformed them into middle or upper-middle-class members of society.**

**Kheni Keyur Ashokbhai**, also from Surat, received a scholarship from E2G, allowing him to obtain a degree in Technology. His father is employed as a farmer, and prior to Kheni's graduation, the family's income was Rs. 110,000 per year. After graduating in 2021, Kheni secured a job with People Strong Technologies, earning a salary of Rs. 1.2 million.



The economic impact resulting from the E2G program has brought generational change to these families and their communities. And these inspiring impacts are made possible by your continuous support. **Consider making a gift to continue this positive cycle, transform more lives, and pass on the wisdom of our fathers to new generations.**
