When Suraj Dhanaji Patil was young, his father passed away — and his mother, an uneducated woman, took up domestic work to provide for the family. However, her earnings were meager, and Suraj’s older brother was forced to drop out of school and take up odd jobs to help his mother.

Suraj, however, was a promising student with big dreams.

It was around this time that workers from Light of Life Trust, a partner NGO for our Educate 2 Success program, came across Suraj and his family. They enrolled him in Project Anando, which provides educational resources, counseling, and career guidance for at-risk children.

The program changed his life. It wasn’t a direct path to success — there were some

challenges — but despite his ups and downs, Suraj ultimately achieved the success he'd dreamed of.
