## Celebrating Women Artisans: The Story of Kheta Ben



In the heart of Kutch's Gandhi Nu Gam village lives
Kheta Ben, a master artisan whose legacy is
preserved on an Indian postal stamp. Selected in
1997 by the Indian Postal Department, she was one
of four women chosen to represent India's diverse
cultural heritage on a special stamp series, alongside
artisans from Ladakh, Kerala, and Arunachal Pradesh.

Despite her national recognition, Kheta Ben maintains a humble presence, welcoming visitors with a warm, toothy grin and proudly displaying the framed stamp bearing her image. Her selection came after her work caught attention at a Delhi handicraft exhibition. Today, her home serves as both a workshop and living museum, where visitors can witness the creation of intricate embroidery and traditional Kutchi crafts, purchasing pieces directly from the artist herself.
