Their body movements, facial expressions, and eye movements narrate and celebrate the story of women's roles as mothers, sisters, daughters, partners, wives, and friends.

Pandita Archana Joglekar is an actress, dancer, choreographer, director, and acclaimed Kathak guru. She has worked in films and television in multiple languages, including Hindi, Marathi, Oriya, Bangla, and Tamil, and with superstars like Rajinikanth, Aamir Khan, and Rekha.

Born a child prodigy trained by her mother, Asha Joglekar, Archana is one of India's finest Kathak dancers and now America's. She has performed worldwide and at music and dance festivals throughout India, including being the first Kathak artisan to perform at the Elephanta Festival in Mumbai. Committed to preserving Indian classical dance, she founded the Archana Arts dance school in New Jersey.

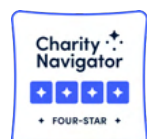

The Road to Empowerment: K4K Team Builds a Path to a Brighter Future

The Kids4Kids (K4K) Committee works to support the Share & Care Signature Program Educate 2 Success (E2S), a program that creates lasting and sustainable change by providing underprivileged children the tools and opportunities they need to get the education they deserve. Their work has been a game-changer for Share & Care.

In 2024 and 2025, the Share & Care Kids4Kids youth-led committee charted an inspiring journey of generosity, leadership, and connection — transforming student-led passion into education for underprivileged children in India, one event at a time. The K4K team has raised nearly \$30,000 through multiple fundraisers this past year.

K4K Pickleball Tournament: In November 2024, Kids4Kids leveraged the growing excitement around pickleball to create a unique and memorable tournament experience. In addition to the actual tournament (with trophies!), activities included an auction spotlighting local businesses, sponsored prize money, word search games, bingo, and a tasty selection of food and drinks.

The event exceeded all expectations and was the K4K team's most successful fundraiser yet. Thanks to their dedicated work and overwhelming support from the community, they doubled their original fundraising goal, raising more than \$20,000.

A heartfelt thank you to all our sponsors and donors — your generosity made this possible!

Kids4Kids Tennis Fundraiser: On Saturday, May 31, 2025, Kids4Kids organized and hosted a competitive tennis tournament. Committee members Saisha Varaiya and Khrish Shah impressed the crowd by advancing to the final round. At the same time, Share & Care President Saumil Parikh and his tennis partner Ravi Munver took home the

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Empowering Women, Enriching Communities

The Share & Care Foundation has played an important role in supporting the Anjali Society for Rural Health and Development's Women Empowerment program with financial assistance and thoughtful guidance. This collaboration has helped expand the program's reach and strengthen its long-term impact on rural women and their families.

Founded in 1989 in the Sabarkantha and Aravalli districts of Gujarat, Anjali has grown into a trusted presence in more than 200 villages. Anjali has always believed that the progress of rural families rests strongly on the empowerment of women. With this vision, its Women Empowerment program has become one of its most impactful initiatives.

At the heart of this program are Self-Help Groups (SHGs). Today, Anjali supports 152 SHGs across 52 villages, bringing together over 2,000 rural women. These groups function as platforms for saving and lending, but their importance goes far beyond finances. They provide women with the confidence to make decisions, manage resources, and take collective action for the welfare of their families and communities.

The program also emphasizes livelihood skills and self-reliance. Tailoring classes, introduced in the aftermath of COVID-19, have enabled many women to gain practical skills and supplement household income. Alongside this, awareness programs in health, education, and agriculture provide women with the knowledge they need to lead healthier, more sustainable lives.

A beautiful example of this empowerment was seen on International Women's Day, when SHG members organized celebrations across 15 villages — a clear reflection of growing confidence, leadership, and unity.

In addition, Anjali pays special attention to adolescent girls, teaching them self-defense skills and helping build self-confidence. For school-age children, programs on personal

hygiene, gender equality, and equity are regularly conducted, ensuring that values of health, dignity, and respect are instilled early on.

This remarkable progress has been made possible not only through local efforts but also through strong partnerships. The results are visible in everyday life. Women who once hesitated to step outside their homes are now leading village discussions, managing finances, and inspiring others to follow their path. Their children grow up watching their mothers take on new roles, ensuring that the ripple effect of empowerment carries into future generations.

Anjali's Women Empowerment program stands as a story of resilience, dignity, and transformation. By combining healthcare, education, and women's leadership, Anjali — together with partners like us, the Share & Care Foundation — has shown how rural women can rise as agents of change, strengthening not just their families, but the fabric of the entire community.

SANGITABEN'S STORY

Sangitaben, from Dadarda village of North Gujarat, has been a proud member of a Self-Help Group since its beginning in 2009. Over the past 16 years, her life has transformed through the power of saving and self-help.

With her first loan from the group, Sangitaben purchased a sewing machine and started tailoring saree blouses. Today, she stitches 5-6 blouses a day, earning over 15,000 Rs each month. This steady income has helped her release a piece of land that was once mortgaged, and support her family's needs.

Her determination didn't stop there. Sangitaben also took loans to improve her home and to support her husband's cutlery business. Together, they were able to buy a van, helping him expand his work and provide better for their

family. Inspired by the savings group, she now sets aside money every month, both with the group and at home.

Today, she has saved Rs 3,00,000 for her daughter's future and proudly lives with independence and dignity. When asked what life would be like without the savings group, Sangitaben replied, "Only after joining did I understand the importance of saving. It has made me independent."

Sangitaben's journey is a powerful real-life story of how Self-Help Groups and microloans can give women the tools to transform not only their own lives but also the lives of their families and communities.

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WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

At Share & Care, we empower women through education in finance, gender equality, personal safety, and digital literacy while providing livelihood training, seed money, and essential tools. We also focus on personal safety for children, self-defense for older women, and support Self-Help Groups for economic independence and gender equity. Our aim is to create a society where women are safe, empowered, and equipped for success.

OUR MISSION

Empower women in its truest sense by bringing a change in the society in which there is an environment of optimal gender equality and equity, women feel safe and can gain livelihood skills with tools to enhance the success.

PROGRAM GOALS

Develop programs by which gender equality and equity issues are addressed in society at large. Make women more educated about their rights in the society and make a society in which there are equal opportunities for women in every sector. Such programs work at grassroots levels and focus on providing to a select group of women who in turn will empower others and so on. Attain best possible results with available resources.

1. Empower women by using innovative approaches such as providing education in banking, personal finance, gender equality issues and personal safety while providing them with training in livelihood skills and digital literacy. Provide them with tools to succeed such as providing seed money to start a trade, providing micro loans and providing market linkages. Provide appropriate equipment such as sewing machines, embroidery machines, cosmetology chairs, catering kits, etc., in appropriate cases.

2. Provide personal safety education to children of school-going age so benefits

are longer lasting. We can also create an environment where there will be lower chances of individuals being perpetrators of violence or bystanders when violence is occurring towards women. Work with NGOs in providing education about basic personal safety to older women including training about how to escape dangerous situations and how to fight back if there is need to.

3. Empower women by enhancing formation and continuation of Self-Help Groups by which empowered women help empower others and continue to enhance gender equality and equity in the society. Self-Help Groups are known

to be a very successful modality that has helped bring economic empowerment in various parts of the world.

4. Empower women by providing them tools for self-development, character building, and promoting and enhancing leadership skills.

5. Involve men wherever appropriate in the process to achieve mindset change in the entire society.

6. Supplementing traditional education of school-going girls with life skills training, basic health education, menstrual hygiene, sports and physical activities education, as well as good nutrition.

HEALTHCARE 2 UNREACHED

Healing the Unseen, Reaching the Unreached

For over 40 years, Share & Care's dedicated journey to bringing healthcare to some of the most underserved communities across India is driven by purpose and promise. Our partners on the ground — the true foot soldiers — carry that promise into the lives of those who need it most.

In the rural villages of Tamil Nadu or the remote forests of Manipur, hospitals and doctors are often miles away. Illnesses go untreated and preventable diseases take lives. But hope arrives in the form of our brightly painted **mobile health** vans operated by our partners Kalanjiyam in Tamil Nadu and the Rural Health Organisation in Manipur. These clinics on wheels bring doctors, nurses, and counselors directly to the poorest communities. Inside, women are screened, children receive nutrition guidance, and the elderly find comfort in long-awaited care. For mothers, this means renewed strength to work, and simply live free from constant fatigue.

Prevention is as vital as treatment. With the Rajkot Cancer Society in Gujarat, we lead efforts in early detection of breast and cervical cancers through routine screenings, mammograms, Pap tests, and HPV vaccinations for young women. Each vaccine is not just protection — it's a promise of a healthier tomorrow.

Anemia affects over 70% of women and children in India. Partnering with the Saurashtra Kidney Research Foundation, we serve over 600 villages in Gujarat's tribal areas. Screenings, deworming, and treatments with iron, folic acid, and vitamin B12 are delivered at just \$1 per person — an astonishingly cost-effective solution with life-changing results.

Saving lives at birth is a cornerstone of our mission. Together with the Sairam Healthcare Charitable Trust in Maharashtra, we support 25 villages through a comprehensive maternal and child health program. Traditional birth attendants, health supervisors, and nutrition educators work hand in hand to provide family planning, immunizations, and low-cost

nutrition guidance. In Gujarat's tribal regions, we fund **Special Neonatal Care Units**, operated by Sewa Rural, across Bharuch and Narmada districts, tackling the three leading preventable causes of infant death: premature birth, delivery complications, and early infections.

We also recognize the urgent need for mental healthcare. Our **Integrated Mental Health & Life Skills** education program empowers rural and tribal adolescents through menstrual hygiene awareness, counseling, and life skills training — ensuring young people, both in and out of school, can thrive. Beyond this, our partner, the Chetana Foundation in Maharashtra, addresses **digital addiction** and related mental illnesses. Where stigma often silences suffering, compassionate counselors listen, guide, and connect individuals to ongoing care. For many, this is the first time their struggles have been acknowledged — and their healing journey begun.

In partnership with the Indian Medical Scientific Research Foundation in Gujarat, we have launched a life-changing initiative to eradicate **thalassaemia** — a blood disorder that causes infections, bone deformities, delayed growth, and even life-threatening complications. We aim to screen 20,000 young people in the first year, preventing high-risk couples from passing thalassaemia major to their children. Our genetic and family counseling, awareness campaigns, and supply of life-saving blood to underprivileged patients are completely free of cost.

Your support fuels every one of these efforts — helps a van reach a new village, a patient receive life-saving care, and a child grow into a healthier future. With Share & Care, healthcare is not a privilege for the few — it is a right for all. Because healing shouldn't depend on distance — and hope should never be out of reach.

Over the past four years, Share & Care has invested \$600,000 in healthcare, benefiting over 300,000 people across 10 projects in India. 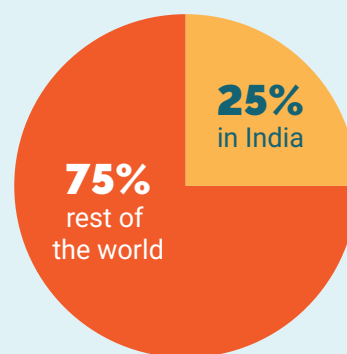

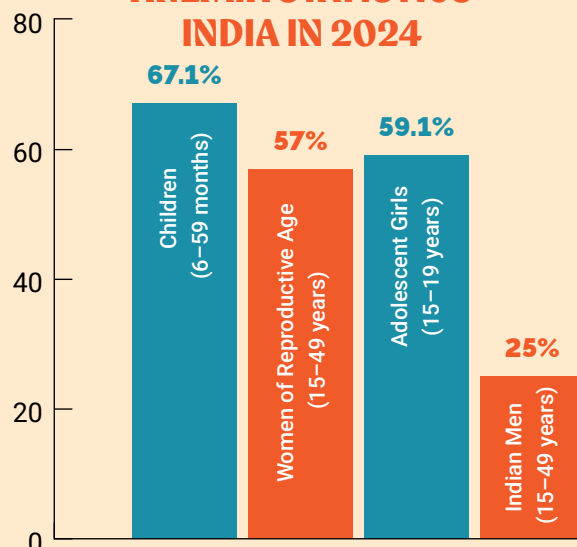

EDUCATE 2 SUCCESS

E2S and the Light of Life Trust Anando Project

Our work with the Anando project, part of the Light of Life Trust, began 10 years ago. Their mission is to reduce poverty through a myriad of channels, including education and livelihood training. Our Educate 2 Success program seeks to help at-risk students complete their education and develop into confident and productive citizens capable of financial independence.

Together, we are working to assist the millions of children in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Odisha who do not attend school due to poverty, neglect, or discrimination. The program is built around removing the roadblocks for students at risk of dropping out and, once they graduate, to qualify for further education or seek employment opportunities based on their interests, aptitude, and capacities. **They call this the 3E approach: Educate, Empower, and Equip for employability.**

Students receive individual support, and programs include providing educational materials, holding remedial education classes in math and English, organizing confidence-building weekend workshops, parent counseling, and teacher training.

EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS IMPACT

Fact: 91% of the parents of Anando beneficiaries earn less than Rs 5,500 monthly. Today, 76% of employed E2S beneficiaries earn between Rs 5,500 and Rs 80,000 monthly. This can have a major, positive impact on families and their communities for generations to come.

ACADEMIC IMPACT FOR FEMALES AND TRIBAL COMMUNITIES

The program has had a phenomenal academic impact on both female and tribal students. Currently, 58% of female beneficiaries — a total of 3,790 — are pursuing higher education. In comparison, 33% of female students in Maharashtra are seeking higher education.



In addition to one-on-one support, E2S students are equipped with the supplies they need to succeed, such as these colorful backpacks.

Tribal populations have traditionally had minimal awareness of the importance of education, and the program has successfully reached 925 tribal students who are currently participating in higher education.

SOCIAL IMPACT

The social impact of early marriage is linked to a higher risk of impoverishment for both individuals and communities. The average age of marriage overall in these regions is 16, while the average age of marriage for female beneficiaries of the program is 22.

More than 1,500 student beneficiaries are actively involved in contributing socially and are members of the Anando Task Force.

Through our Educate 2 Success program, Share & Care is helping hundreds of at-risk students every year complete their education and become compassionate, confident, and productive adults capable of achieving financial independence. Thanks to you, our supporters, E2S is making a real and growing impact on families and their communities. Let's keep at it until the day we're no longer needed.

A HOLISTIC APPROACH

Our holistic approach helps children develop into productive and confident individuals who make positive career choices. Weekend empowerment workshops teach self-confidence, and after-school English and math classes offer supplementary instruction. Our social workers also conduct home visits to evaluate living conditions and engage parents in their children's education, and counseling sessions are given to students in need of extra guidance.

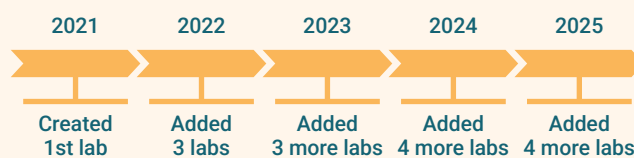

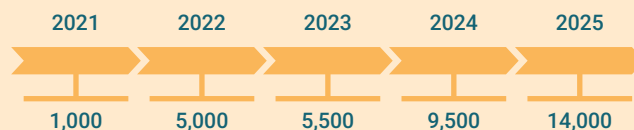

COMPUTER LABS FOR DIGITAL TRAINING

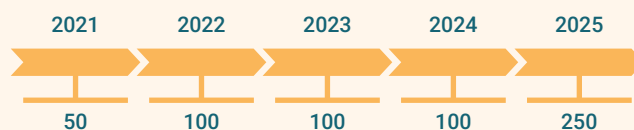


STUDENTS GETTING DIGITAL EXPOSURE

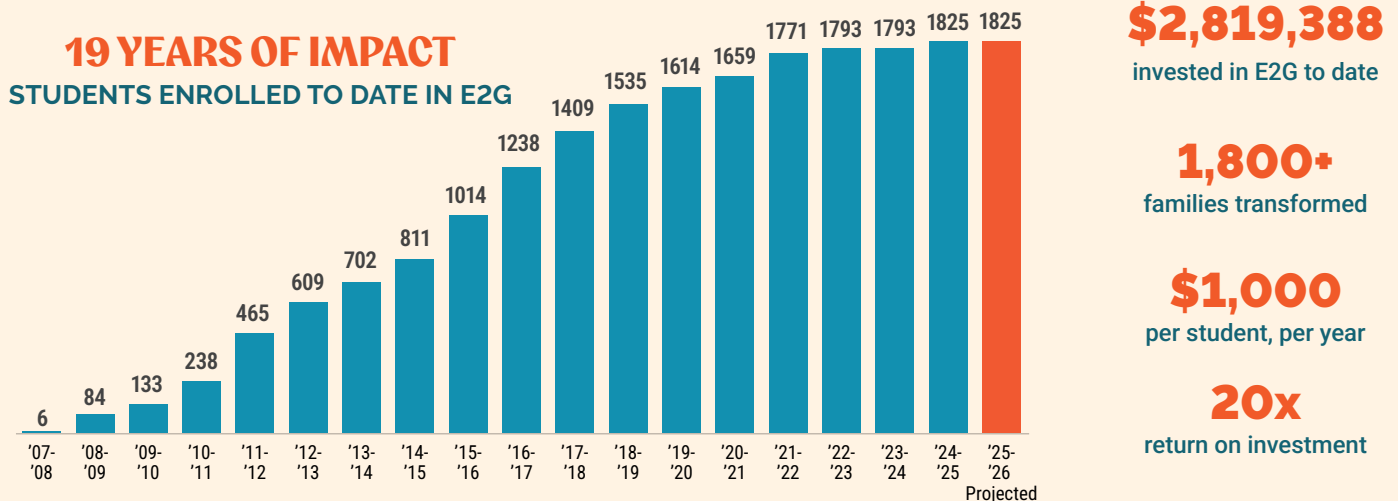

EDUCATE 2 GRADUATE

Our Educate 2 Graduate (E2G) program provides up to \$1,000 per year scholarships to brilliant, but financially disadvantaged college-going students over 4–5 years, requiring them to graduate in a professional degree course in Engineering, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy or IT. The students are selected carefully based on defined criteria of financial need, their academic performance and the quality of the colleges they have selected for degree courses. It provides them with partial financial support, skill-building training, and career guidance to find well-paying jobs after graduation. Since the inception of the E2G program in 2006, Share & Care has awarded over \$2.8 million in scholarships to over 1,800 brilliant, yet economically challenged scholars to pursue professional college degrees. Our typical scholar comes from a needy family of four or more, with an average household income of around 2 lac per yr. The E2G graduate earnings range from over 3 lac per year to over 90 lac per year.

- We work with five NGO partners in India to implement our E2G program, including HEST and SNT, both in Gujarat, LPF and Y4D both in Maharashtra, and Kalanjyiam in Tamil Nadu.
- Students selected are in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class.
- Their families have incomes of less than \$2,500 USD per year.
- Each student's metrics are tracked throughout their degree program to monitor progress.

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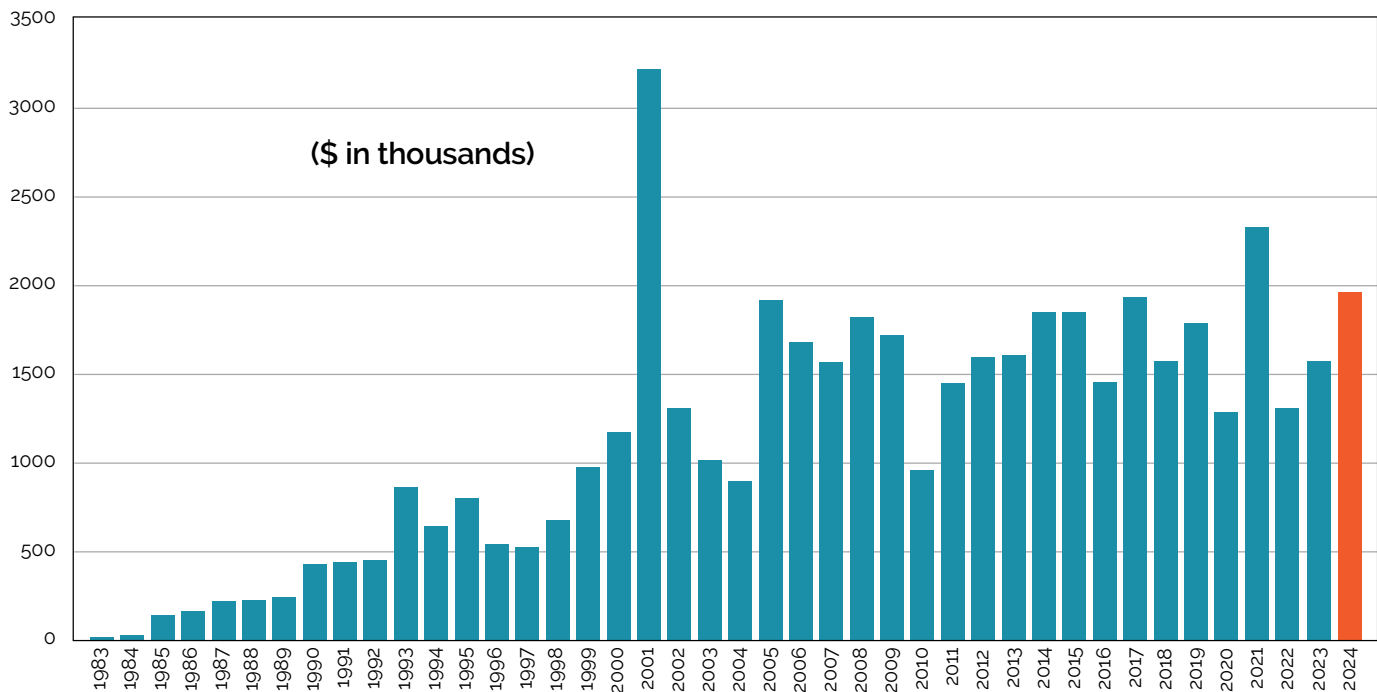
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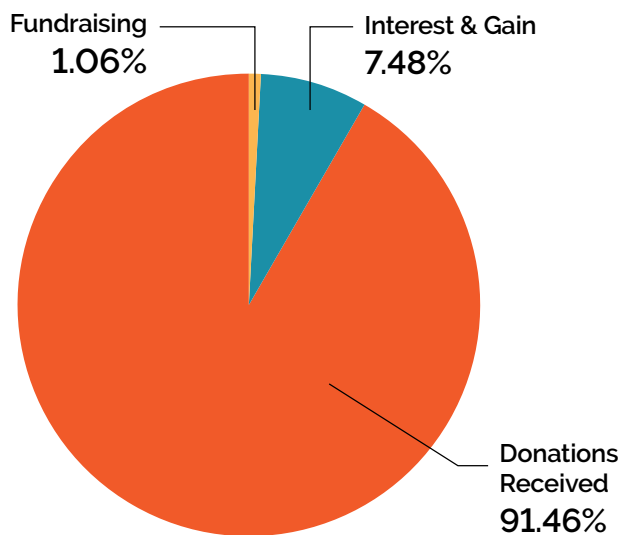

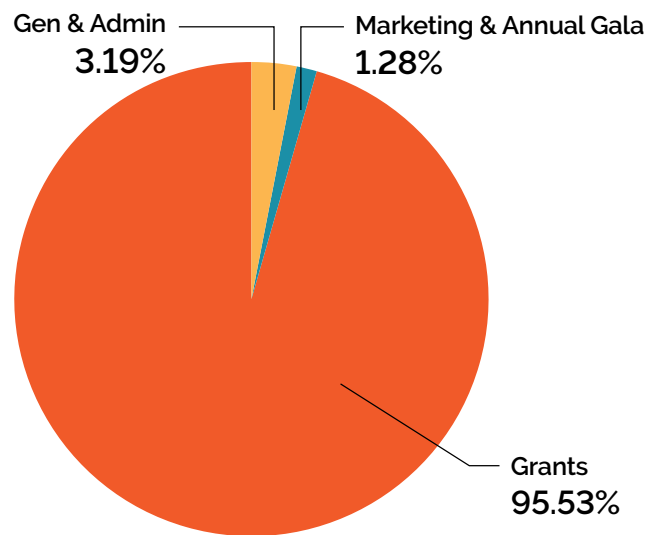

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

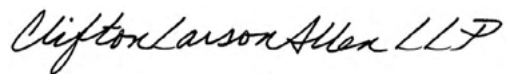
Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Arya Caroline Parikh was the brightest light in our lives – joyful, vibrant, and endlessly loving. She adored dressing up in colorful, festive Indian clothes and Disney princess outfits. She loved gymnastics and Taekwondo, swam like a mermaid, and believed wholeheartedly in unicorns and magic. She had an infectious laugh, a kind spirit, and a heart big enough to fill every room. She was our Gerber baby – a true beauty inside and out – who made friends wherever she went and left joy in her wake. On her birthday, August 23, some of her ashes were dispersed at sunrise atop idyllic Mount Haleakalā in the Edenic state of Hawaii – a place that Arya dreamed of visiting, a place that was recently held in her heart.

Rest in peace, our sweet Arya. Our souls will forever bathe in your glorious essence, illuminated by your brilliant radiance. You will always be ours – forever immortalized in our hearts.
